NEW YEAR'S MESSAGE 2023 BY BISHOP LAWRENCE SYDNEY NICASIO

A BLESSED NEW YEAR 2023 FROM ME TO ALL OF YOU!

Yes! It is a new year. It is the New year 2023! Are you just happy that you get to see and to be welcomed into the new year 2023? Is that the only meaning of the new year to you, to us?

As our world becomes 'smaller', we realize that we are closer to each other than we think. The Holy Father reminds us constantly when he prays for the suffering and displaced members of our Common Home-those who suffer in Ukraine, the migrants at the US-Mexico Border...

At home in Belize, I believe that many of us have come to the realization that SELFISHNESS, living focusing on oneself is never the answer for unity and peace in our homes, in our society or in our country. Focusing on oneself and not on the greater good has forced us to chart our own journeys in life, living the way I want, doing things the way I want, deciding for me and me alone and disregarding the effects of our actions on others. The fruit of the Holy Spirit is LOVE. LOVE of God and LOVE of neighbor. Know this, His name is EMMANUEL-God with us!

Many of us have come to realize that we belong to a God who is not about himself, but a God who always puts us sinful children first in everything. He is a God who would not allow us to be alone, but a God who chooses to live among us and to be like us in all things but sin. We ought to realize God's closeness to us and our closeness to each other as God "pikney'. Let me remind you what He has told us, "You will be my people and I will be your God".

In his book, "The Church of Mercy", Pope Francis writes:" The Lord wants us to belong to a Church that knows how to open her arms and welcome everyone, that is not a house for the few, but a house for everyone, where all can be renewed, transformed, sanctified by love—the strongest and the weakest, sinners, the indifferent, those who feel discouraged or lost".
