EASTER MESSAGE 2023 BY BISHOP LAWRENCE SYDNEY NICASIO

We, people of good will, joined our hearts on the 40-day journey of Lent, all along, believing and trusting in Him who leads the way on this journey. We believed and trusted that at the end of this journey, our lives would never be the same. We gave up some material things and we became even more spiritual and more loving. We humbled ourselves before our Lord God and we gave, until it hurts, to the neediest in our community. Why do all this? Why join Catholic Christian on this journey?

We all took this journey because of a God who truly loves his children from the heart, a God who has accepted us as his children, as we truly are. We are Zacchaeus. We are Mary Magdalen. We are Peter. We are the Samaritan Woman at the well. We are that man born blind. We are Jairus. We are Lazarus. We are the sinners for whom He came to serve in this our Common Home. As his own, his children, He cannot ignore or deny us. He is like that parent who asks the question of her child - What more must I do for you, my child?
